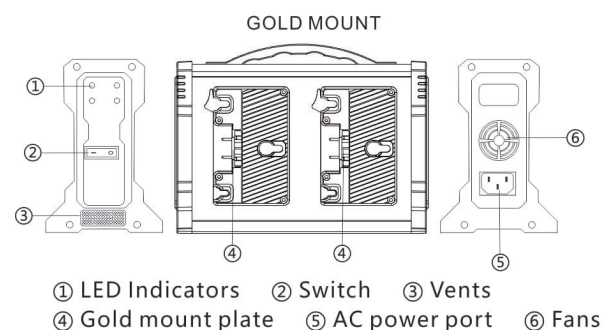
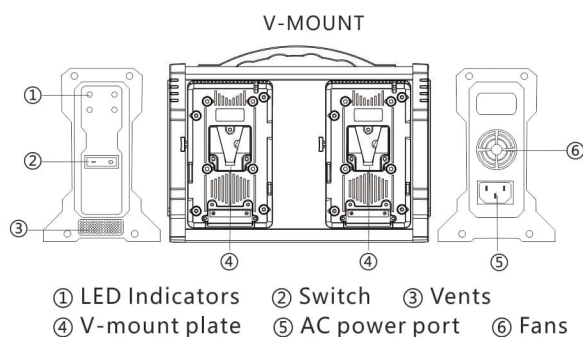

This is a dedicated quad charger for 26V lithium-ion camera batteries.

It offers the option of either a V-mount or a Gold mount. It features four channels, allowing it to power four 26V batteries simultaneously.

Operation

- Connect the charger to 90-240V AC power with the supplied power cable.
- Hang the batteries onto the charger's plates.
- Switch on charging function, the indicator turns RED, charging starts.
- When the indicator turns ORANGE, the battery is nearly full charged.
- When the indicator turns GREEN, the battery is fully charged.
- Switch off and remove the battery.
